
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A.A. Preamble

I Get Drunk, We Stay Sober

Perhaps some of the modern hospital rehabilitation programs could learn something from these old rehabs. Typically, today, it costs anywhere from ten to twenty thousand dollars to go through a hospital substance abuse program. My stay at the CareUnit in San Francisco cost my company's insurance company sixteen. Almost all hospitals suggest that the patient attend AA meetings after his or her release.

Although AA in Reno was still comparatively small in the sixties and seventies, it seems to have been a vital time for the growth of the fellowship. Jim D. joined Reno AA in the late sixties: "I read the Jack Alexander article in '41 and thought it was some kind of missionary movement." It took twenty six years for Jim to get to the program, but in January of 1967 he dialed the number he found in the paper and was introduced to AA. When he first sobered up, Jim had his own business and a lot of time on his hands. In the beginning, time is a terrible thing to the alcoholic. A drunk drinks time away. When (if) he finally gets sober, often his biggest fear is what to do with himself. We're told to get right into some kind of service helping other alcoholics. Jim ended up starting Reno's AA newsletter, The Bracer:

"We just called it The Bracer because people wanted a bracer in the morning to get started. We used to put down that it was published by the Wine Press. It was just a little one page thing. I was doing it to keep myself sober. If somebody else got something else out of it, that was fine."

In 1971, several people started looking into the possibility of another Alano Club. It depends on who you talk to, but according to Harry W., the original board members of this new club consisted of three women and three men:

Joanne M., Gladys D., Rose A., Bill J., Harry W., and Harley W. (Jim P. and Marguerite K. are the other names I heard associated with the club.) They obtained an old telephone switching station and turned it into the Sparks Alano Club. Harley W. built the heavy tables that are still in use today at the club. As might be expected, in the beginning there was some competition between the Alano Club and the Driars Club. "The Alano Club was formed because of resentments towards the Driars Club. Verna M. [the founder of Beacon House] used to tell her women at the house if I ever hear anything about you being in the Driars Club you'll pack your bags and get out of here" (Harry W.).

A year after the Alano Club opened, the first Reno Spring Festival was held at the Nugget in Sparks. Although technically festivals and clubs are not associated with AA, they have been very important to this city's fellowship. Jim D. was on his way back from the Las Vegas Roundup when he got the idea for a festival in Reno. He mentioned the idea to his sponsor, Bob Ho, who went on to be treasurer of the first seven festivals. Jim was the first chairman: "Our main reason for starting it was for money for the service structure of AA in Nevada." Jim, Bob Ho., Jim P., Harry W., and Pat B. were all involved in the first Spring Festival. Coastline Whitey got their banquet speaker for them: "I was doing some painting for Jim D. when he asked me about a Spring Festival in Reno. I told them that they needed a good speaker who could bring in a lot of people at the first. I used to go to a meeting in Beverly Hills with Chuck C.6 so I called him up. Chuck said he'd speak but first I had to promise him a jackpot. It so happens Chuck did get a jackpot on a dollar machine." There were 92 people at that first banquet. Today they hold the festival in a huge banquet room at Bally's. Several thousand AA's come from all over the United States and the world to attend.

In April of 1973, Bob Ho was in New York at an AA conference: "I was talking to some guy from Massachusetts or somewhere about a Gratitude Dinner his fellowship put on in November. Their groups weren't strong enough to send any money to New York, and this way they could guarantee a contribution to G.S.O. [the General Service Office in N.Y.]. I came back here and got together with Jim and we started the Gratitude Dinner. We had the first ones out in Stead at the university dining hall out there. We had 70 or 80 people at the first one. They had about 750 to 800 at the Reno Convention Center last year." This year they expect 1100 people to attend the Gratitude Dinner.

Finally, in August of 1974, the first Central Office opened on St. Lawrence Street. Ben B. from Carson City was the first Coordinator of the office, and in March of 1975, Intergroup7 was incorporated. They then received nonprofit status from the state of Nevada and the I.R.S. Soon afterwards by laws were drawn up by Intergroup stating, among other things, how the office was to be run. Eight and a half years later they moved to South Park Street where Don M. was Coordinator. Then, in March of this year, the office settled at its present location on South Rock Blvd. in Sparks.

Apparently there was some opposition to the opening of a Central Office in Reno by other AA members, especially some of the old-timers. I questioned several old-timers about this but was never really able to get a straight answer. A lot of people have a difficult time accepting change, but many alcoholics abhor it. Perhaps the old-timers objected to the rapid growth of the Reno fellowship.


